Youth Protection Training

Awards & Recognitions & Training Info NOVA Awards

I NE BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA'S NUVA AWARDS PROGRAM INCORPORATES LEARNING WITH COOL ACTIVITIES AND exposure to science, technology, engineering and mathematics for Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, and Venturers. The hope is that the requirements and activities for earning these awards stimulates interest

In STEM-related fields and shows how science, technology, engineering and mathematics apply to everyday living and the world around them. Counselors and mentors help bring this engaging, contemporary, and fun program to life for youth members.

The Nova Awards

There are four Nova awards for Cub Scouts, Webelos Scouts, Boy Scouts, and Venturers. Each award covers one component of STEM—science, technology, engineering, or mathematics.

Cub Scout Nova awards: Science Everywhere, Tech Talk, Swing!, and 1-2-3 Go!

Boy Scout Nova awards: Shoot!, Start Your Engines, Whoosh!, and Designed to Crunch

Venturer Scout Nova awards: Launch!, Power Up, Hang On!, and Numbers Don't Lie

For their first Nova award, Scouts earn the distinctive Nova award patch. After that, a Scout can earn three more Nova awards, each one recognized with a separate pi (π) pin-on device that attaches to the patch. The patch and the three devices represent each of the four STEM topics—science, technology, engineering, and mathematics.

The Supernova Awards

The Supernova awards have more rigorous requirements than the Nova awards. The requirements and activities were designed to motivate youth and recognize more in-depth, advanced achievement in STEM-related



September 2nd

The United States Treasury Department was established, 1789

September 4th

George Eastman received patent for roll-film camera, 1888

September 5th

The nation's first Labor Day Parade, sponsored by the Knights of Labor, as held in New York City, 1882 Baltimore Orioles Cal Ripken, Jr., tied Lou Gehrig's consecutive professional baseball game steak of 2130 games, 1995

September 7th

The Professional Football Hall of Fame was dedicated in Canton, Ohio, 1963

Two Panama Canal treaties that transferred control of the canal to Panama by the year 2000 were signed by President James Carter and Panama's head of state, Brigadier general Omar Torrijos Herrera, 1977

September 8th

A hurricane, reaching winds up to 120 mph, struck Galveston, Texas, killing 6000 persons, and causing property damage estimated at \$20 million, 1900

Margaret Gorman, from Washington, D.C., was crowned the first Miss America, in Atlantic City, New Jersey, 1921

September 9th

Mounted police were used for the first time in New York City, 1904 Singer Elvis Presley made his first appearance on the "Ed Sullivan Show," 1956

September 10th

Elias Howe, of Spencer, Massachusetts, received a patent for his sewing machine; the first in the United States with an eye-pointed needle, 1847
