History of Veteran's Day - November 11th

World War I – known at the time as "The Great War" - officially ended when the Treaty of Versailles was signed on June 28, 1919, in the Palace of Versailles outside the town of Versailles, France. However, fighting ceased seven months earlier when an armistice, or temporary cessation of hostilities, between the Allied nations and Germany went into effect on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. For that reason, November 11, 1918, is generally regarded as the end of "the war to end all wars."

In November 1919, President Wilson proclaimed November 11 as the first commemoration of Armistice Day with the following words: "To us in America, the reflections of Armistice Day will be filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory, both because of the thing from which it has freed us and because of the opportunity it has given America to show her sympathy with peace and justice in the councils of the nations..."

As we approach the fall and winter again, our leadership would like to remind all of our parents and volunteer leaders that "If Swanton Schools close due to weather, then our meeting that night will be cancelled."

As our annual Thanksgiving Day approaches, some more little know information to be thankful for as the Pilgrims were thankful...

Did you know...

As you walk up the steps to the building which houses the US Supreme Court you can see, near the top of the building, a row of the world's law givers and each one is facing one in the middle who is facing forward with a full, front view.... It is MOSES and he is holding the Ten Commandments!

November Historical & Current Events

November 1st

The United States Weather Bureau began its operation, 1870

November 2nd

General George Washington issued his "Farewell Address to the Army," 1783

November 3rd

The Continental Army was disbanded, 1783

The Hay-Bunau-Varilla Treaty was negotiated, which gave the U.S. full control of a ten-mile-wide canal zone in Panama, in

return for \$10 million in gold plus a yearly payment of \$250,000, 1903

The Soviet Union launched the spacecraft, Sputnik Two, 1957

November 5th

"Guy Fawkes Day" was celebrated in New York, per a law that ordered that all ministers must preach a sermon on this date in commemoration of the discovery of the plot to blow up the English House of Lords in 1605, 1665

November 8th

The French museum, the "Louvre" was opened to the public, 1793

The first electric lamps were placed in trains on the Chicago and North Western's Overland Limited, which ran from Chicago to California, 1906

November 9th

The Lady and the Panda written by Ruth Harkness about Su Lin (a panda) captured this date, 1936 special note, the panda was not brought back in a cage or on a leash, but carried in Ms Harkness' arms!

November 11th

World War I ended, 1918 (Armistice Day)

President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed November 11 as the first commemoration of Armistice Day, 1919

The Unknown Soldier of World War I was buried at Arlington National Cemetery, after lying in state at the Capitol rotunda in Washington, D.C., 1921

November 13th

The Vietnam War Memorial was dedicated in Washington, D.C., 1982

November 16th

General William T. Sherman with a force of about 62,000 men left Atlanta, Georgia in flames and began his "March to the Sea." 1864

The Space Shuttle Columbia completed its first flight, 1982

November 21st

The Mayflower Compact was signed, 1620

Inventor Thomas A. Edison announced the invention of his phonograph, 1877

November 22nd

President John Fitzgerald Kennedy (JKF) was assassinated in Dallas, Texas, while riding in a motorcade, and pronounced dead at 1 p.m. Governor John Connally of Texas, who accompanied Kennedy was severely wounded, but recovered. Vicepresident Lyndon Baines Johnson (LBJ) was sworn in as the 36th President of the United States at 2:39 p.m., on board Air Force One, at Love Air Field in Dallas.

November 25th

A patent was issued for evaporated milk, 1884

November 26th

Captain Cook discovered Maui, 1778

Numerous priceless art treasures, hidden by the Nazi's during WWII, were found in Austria, 1963

November 27th

New York's Pennsylvania Station opened, 1910

November 29th

The first Army-Navy football game was played at West Point, New York. Navy won 24-0, 1891 Army has 49 wins.... Navy has 52 wins and there have been 7 ties in this historic rivalry. And the US Naval Academy has won this game since 2002 with the closest game being in 2011 27-21 the score.
